# Strategic Plan Update - Academic Rigor

As part of the 2021-2024 Jefferson Academy Strategic Plan, the board identified academic rigor as a goal. The Board approved guiding principles, targets, and practices of academic rigor, in order to achieve this goal. You can read more about academic rigor <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>.

We are pleased to share the progress being made and share some recent academic rigor principles in action.

### • Concurrent Enrollment:

The average pass rate for FRCC concurrent enrollment students from all schools is 89.6%. JA concurrent students have a pass rate of 99.7%!

Through this program, JA has saved families more than \$140,000 in college tuition costs.

Out of our 423 high school students, 123 students participated in concurrent enrollment for the fall semester; which is almost 30% of our high school students.

## • Summit Academy Sports Program:

Summit Academy is launching a program for elite athletes that will allow them to participate in their athletic endeavors at an elite level while still being able to participate in an academically rigorous program.
