Adams Group has completed its Audit and has submitted its report to the Committee and subsequently to the Board. The Finance Committee reviewed current financial data at organizational level and then by each school individually. Business team reports funding and expense categories on track as anticipated. Committee reviewed necessary amendments to the Budget, adjusting to align with actual expenses this school year in categories such as: Spec.Ed, Technology, and Instructional Materials/Equipment. Budget consideration include increased capital outlays for future development. Currently, the committee is evaluating four improvement projects across Secondary, Elementary, and Summit South. Related to that, budget projections include increased cost for professional evaluation (architectural, structural engineering, legal) necessary to establish feasibility of projects. The Amended Budget 2023-24 is available for review and consideration.

Executive Director's Report

Jeffco School Directory: We recently learned that our Summit programs were removed from Jeffco's School Directory listing. That is an internal web based Jeffco school directory. As a result, the internal Safety Checklist principals and Jeffco Security

use to schedule Lockdowns, track fire drills and keep single sight contact information were deleted. No one can identify why or how that happened. However, our principals are scheduling their Lockdown drills directly with Jeffco Security, fire drills are always tracked on sight and Jeffco Security has their contact information. We don't anticipate any challenges as we work with the district on ensuring all our campuses remain safe.

Hope House: Over the last 2 months we ran into some changes/challenges with qualifying students at Hope House for state funding. We are unsure if the changes are coming from Jeffco or CDE. Thanks to much work on the part of Ms. Leoni and Hope House, 7 of the 10 girls we hoped to qualify were funded. This will allow the HH program to continue this school year. We will be setting up a meeting with Jeffco to find out more and ask to be informed about changes to expectations earlier than once we enter the October count window.

Elementary ESSER HVAC Project: The HVAC project to replace the oldest units at the elementary school (on the 2 story) has been contracted. Along with replacing the RTU units, dampers will be installed in every room to provide teachers/EAs the ability to adjust the temperature in their room. The project is currently scheduled to start the first week in June and finish about 2 weeks later. This is being funded through ESSER funds which must be spent prior to September 2024. The ESSER budget for the project is \$300,000 with the actual cost coming in at \$275,000. The other \$25,000 of ESSER funds will be shifted to teacher development with an equal amount being set aside in the JA budget for future HVAC issues.

JCSC & DAC: The Jeffco Charter School Consortium (JCSC) raised concerns with the district regarding how the DAC (District Accountability Committee) has been operating recently. There seems to be an under representation from charter schools on the DAC and potential policy changes (and practices) that appear detrimental to charter schools long-term. Three of us were able to meet with the Chief of Schools about this. He stated he was aware and is working to mitigate some of the issues being advanced by current DAC members. However, it is difficult as the DAC is a Board committee and therefore directly responsible to the BOE (Board of Education) and not district staff. The week before Thanksgiving he sent out a request for additional charter representatives (parents, administrators and board members) to join the DAC. He also committed to letting charter schools know of potential changes in policy before they went to the BOE for discussion. This is a rising challenge that needs our on-going attention and involvement.

Homeschool Policy Changes: Two weeks ago the State Board of Education was presented with some potential policy changes for homeschool programs. Ms. Scarato attended the state board meeting and reported that it appears CDE staff is requesting these changes though they did not seem to be well received by board members. There are differing opinions as to the impact these proposed changes would have on our programs and their funding. We have been in communication with the Colorado League of Charter Schools about this and will continue to monitor the situation as it progresses.
